SUMMARY

The Sociomedical Institute combines knowledge and research orientations of sociology, anthropology and medical and health psychology. Broad array of research topics extends from population dynamics (fertility behaviour and migration) and family farming to mental health, stress at workplace and long-term care.

In the year 2011, researchers completed many tasks and works in the frame of the Programme (*Language, Memory and Politics of Representation*), three basic projects (*Intergenerational solidarity in farm families; Community care of the elderly in Slovenia; Developmental strategies of contemporary family farms*), two target-research projects (*Challenges and needs of agricultural knowledge transfer in Slovenia; Developmental orientations of farms in Slovenia*), two market projects (*Employee and employers assistance program for reducing work related stress and its harmful effects; Risk assessment of mental health issues in residents of Republic of Slovenia within different statistical regions with adapted methodology of OECD's Index of better life*), Health promotion programme during the period 2011–2012 (*Life with mood disorder: educational programme for coping with bipolar and depressive mood disorder*) and international project (*Electronic standard coding and mapping of services for long-term care - eDESDE-LTC*). The project *eDESDE-LTC* was completed in 2011, and its results were presented in Brussels to various experts and researchers of health and social politics (representatives of the WHO, European Commission and OECD), and also at the press conference. Completed was also the project home-page and published was the project monograph.

In its scientific work, the institute cooperates with several institutions in Slovenia: the University of Ljubljana (the Biotechnical Faculty and the Faculty of Arts), the University of Maribor, The University of Nova Gorica, Psychiatric society at the Slovene medical association, the University psychiatric hospital, the Ministry of labour, family and social affairs of the Republic of Slovenia, the Ministry of health of the RS, the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Food of the RS, the Educational and Research Institute Ljubljana, Humana-Association of relatives in care for mental health, Society DAM.

In 2011, the institute shows also its international cooperation with the PSICOST Research Association (PSICOST, Spain), London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE, Great Britain), the University of Vienna (UWIEN, Austria), SINTEF Technology and Society (SINTEF, Norway) and The Public Health Association (PHA, Bulgaria).
